As I write this in late September, annual club Open Houses are over; returning dancers have been welcomed back; and clubs are getting down to the business of teaching the arcane art of Square, Round and Line Dancing. Its still a little too soon to know how well our collective recruiting efforts have succeeded this year, that information will not be available until late October, but initial reports are encouraging. All we can do right now is cross our fingers and hope.

Some of you are busy learning new dance skills and others are working on improving existing dance skills. Many of you are acting as Angels helping our newest dancers master the intricacies of this strange new world of dance. Whatever you are doing, remember to have fun doing it. Sure dancing is good physical and mental exercise, sure it helps to keep us young in body and in mind, but if you're not having fun, you won't stick with it. So laugh off your mistakes, vow to do better, kick back, enjoy yourself and DANCE!

CHANGES TO EOSARDA'S BY-LAWS

In light of some confusion about membership requirements, Council of Dancers passed a Motion last April stipulating that, with the exception of:

- people attending Open Houses designed to recruit new dancers;
- dancers who drop into a club only one time; and
- visitors registered in another region,
- all people dancing with our member clubs or at club or Association sponsored dance events, must be registered members of EOSARDA.

The Motion also requires member clubs to take all reasonable measures to ensure compliance with the above.

CHANGE IN BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MANDATE

In light of on-going difficulty in recruiting a sufficient number of Directors to allow it to fulfill all of its duties, Council of Dancers decided that the Association's Board of Directors would have 5 "necessary functions" for Dance Year 2018/19. These are:

- publishing Square Time,
- distributing EOSARDA Bulletins,
- maintaining the eoDance.ca website,
- registering dancers, and
- representing EOSARDA at the Ontario Square and Round Dance Federation.

At the same time, Council approved a budget for Dance Year 2018/19 that provides for spending above that required to accomplish these five priority tasks, thereby providing the Board with the authority to undertake additional tasks, time and resources permitting.

Subsequent to the Council meeting, the number of Voting Directors increased to 10. In light of this increase in personnel, in addition to the five priority tasks established by Council, the Board has determined that it will be able to continue to administer the following programs in 2018/19:

- The Dance Leader Training Subsidy Program
- The New Dancer Recruitment Subsidy Program
- Association participation in New Dancer Celebrations
- EOSARDA's Dance Dangle Program
- Processing of Trillium Award nominations
- The Publicity Network discussion group
- Association recognition of major anniversaries and accomplishments
- Co-sponsorship of Swing into Spring
- Regional publicity initiatives
- A review of the number and nature of Association sponsored dances.

CHANGES TO EOSARDA'S BUDGETARY CYCLE

Given that, for all practical purposes, our dance year operates from fall to summer of each year, our budgetary cycle should match that reality. Therefore the Board decided that Budget proposals would no longer be made to the November Council meeting. Rather a draft budget for the following Fiscal Year would be presented to Council in April. The year-end financial report for the previous Fiscal Year will be presented to council in November.

Accordingly a draft budget for 2018/19 was presented to and adopted by Council of Dancers on April 15, 2018.

Thanks to a lot of hard work by our IT Director, Bob Summers, the Seaway Valley Square and Round Dance Association's web site has ben fully and seemlessly integrated into eodance.ca. Well done Bob!

MEET YOUR DANCE LEADERS

This story starts with me attending a Fun Night at the local Legion. It was great fun, but I decided not to pursue classes like many of my friends did. However, after 4 weeks of folks bugging me to go, I decided to go on the 5th week, this was approximately Oct 21/74. After some time, the dancers found me to be dancing better than the folks who started on the first week so many dared me to start to call. Six weeks after I started, I called my first tip at the club Christmas Dance. In the new year, I borrowed records from the club caller and practiced faithfully every day. Back in those days the next level was called ECL, experienced club level, which I mastered very quickly during the summer months. In the fall a group of experienced dancers wanted to learn the level called 100 advanced calls, so they formed a group which was by invitation only and you had to be dancing ECL for at least 2 years. That group started with 5 squares, but I was not allowed to attend as I had just started to dance. This did not make me a happy dancer so, Bernie Campbell and I discussed what our options were. The other group was dancing every other Sunday night to a well known local caller, Les Heaps to learn the 100 advanced calls. He happened to be our club caller, so we approached him with our suggestion which was, why not call for us on the other Sunday night that he was not calling for the experienced group. He said ok, so we made flyers and announced our plan to learn the 100 advanced calls. On our first night we had 11 squares sign up for the lessons, which included all the ECL Group as they wanted more practice. This eventually led to the forming of (MAD) Montreal Acey Deuceys in 1975.

In the fall of 1975, I began a teen group which was my first class that I would teach to square dance. They were wonderful dancers. We had 2 ½ squares of eager teens who would dance every Monday night at the church hall plus 2 afternoons a week in my basement. I graduated them in early March at full plus level, all positions. After that session I thought I must be a great teacher until I got my first adult class the next fall, that was quite different than the

teens. In the fall of 1976, Les Heaps decided to move back to Louisiana and this left some clubs without a caller. We had many callers in Montreal at the time, so it should not have been a problem to fill the void left by his absence. However, I ended up with all the clubs, including the club dancing advanced, as during the advanced dancing, folks were asking me to help them with the calls. I went from calling 1 night a week to 5 nights a week. I attended 1 callers school that year, so I was calling a little more than a year. This is how it went at the caller's school on the first night. Everyone called for 5 min and they evaluated you. The next morning, names were called out and you were put in a group, new callers were in group 1, callers with 5 years' experience were put in group 2, very experienced callers were grouped together in number 3. I was put in group 3.

We then split into groups. When I sat down the guy to my right introduced himself as Dave from Washington and he had been calling for 26 years, the guy on my left introduced himself and said he had been calling for 21 years. I simply told them my name and never said that I had not even been calling for 2 years. I was lucky as this was the time sight calling was becoming the rage and I was young and very receptive to this style of calling. The other callers were very set in their ways which made it a little more difficult for them. My mentor was Jack Lasry and for 5 days and nights, I never left his side. We talked about every detail in the calling field. The cafeteria was a 15-20 min walk and I walked with him for every meal.

After a few years of calling 5 times a week and practicing every day, I got to meet many other callers who had started near the time I did, most were living in the US. By this time, I was being hired to call at festivals in eastern Canada and the eastern US. Many of those callers went on to call full time but I had 2 small children and I also had a good job working as a lithographer. For many years I was second guessing myself for staying with my job instead of becoming a

full-time caller. As it worked out, I made the correct choice.

In the 1980's I was still working and calling 8 dances a week. My travel schedule was somewhat restricted as I could only use my 5 weeks' vacation traveling to call dances. In Montreal we had a terrific increase in new dancers, and classes were the largest they had ever been. By mid-80's I had taught myself to call up to C3A. It was toward the end of the 80's that I decided to have my own square dance hall. I was able to rent a great location right near a popular steak house restaurant in Montreal. I called there every day, and my traveling almost stopped completely. Every night was a different level with the smallest group being 12 squares and the largest group was 25 squares. Can you imagine, I ran a mainstream workshop with 25 squares? This went on for 6 years. Many folks left their shoes at the hall as they were there so often. As the dancer population grew smaller I had to leave the hall and go back to church halls and rec centers.

After working for 38 years, in 2004, I decided to retire from my job as Technical advisor for a large lithography company and spend my retirement calling. It took many years, but I guess now I am a full-time caller although I was calling 8 dances a week so I guess I was always a full-time caller. Now as organizations contacted me to call, I was able to travel to do more festivals and weekends. I have been lucky enough to be hired to call in 9 provinces in Canada and 25 US states. My travels however did not stop there. I have been hired to call festivals or weekends in Sweden, Denmark, Germany, Czech Republic, Austria, France, Belgium, Netherlands, Norway and England many times. We have been to some of these countries 8 or 10 times over the years. Besides calling, I have been on staff at caller's schools in Alberta and New Hampshire and have operated 3 callers education weekends in Montreal. I was also asked to prepare the material for the Pacific Northwest Teen Festival which I did in 1990 and 1993. During my time calling I have been involved in many aspects of our activity. I worked as an advisor for the (MASDA) Montreal Area Square Dance Association for 17 years and I served on the executive of the Champlain Callers Association

in NY. I was also president of the Montreal Area Callers Association for many years. Over the years to name a few very special square dance events, I have been on staff at, Canadian Challenge Convention, WASCA, IPAC in Europe, MASDA, T&D Convention for many years and AACE to name a few. The years calling square dances have been very good to us. At present I am calling for Seaway Swingers. Circles and Squares, Swinging B's and 2 nights for Montreal Acey Deuceys. We have friends all over the world who we have met through square dancing. One constant thing a caller must have is a great partner and my wife Avena fills that part to perfection. We are always trying to make things better and she does a terrific job organizing all the square dance weekends. They would not operate the same without her. Together we have 4 kids living in Ottawa, Toronto, Calgary and Los Angeles. Also 4 grandchildren 2 in Toronto and 2 in Los Angeles.



Capital Carousels

As I write this, members from Capital Carousels round dance club are marking their calendars for Friday & Saturday, October 26-27, 2018, when we will be welcoming Steve and Irene Bradt from Easton, Pennsylvania, at Parkdale United Church, to teach us new dances and styling techniques at our annual Capital Caper Round Dance Weekend. As usual, we anticipate a dedicated group of Montreal dancers will be eagerly joining us for their Phase 3 to 5 teaches and a round dance party on Saturday night.

Our Halloween party will be October 29th and a barn dance on Nov 26th .


As usual we will be hosting our New Year's Eve dance with Geoff Clarke calling and Jean Clingin as cuer. Tickets are \$25 in advance only.


